Training must be provided including animal-specific information on the disease and health problems associated with a given species. The Principal Investigator (PI), or their designee, is responsible for ensuring that appropriate individuals receive training. On request, the Director of Animal Care can provide training regarding appropriate handling of animals.

Health Questionnaire. A confidential health questionnaire will be completed and, based upon evaluation of the information provided to the medical provider, further medical evaluations may be necessary. The medical provider will determine the frequency of further health assessment.

Physical Exams, if necessary, will be given by the medical provider with an emphasis towards problems which may be specific to the animal species a person contacts. Exams will be given at the discretion of the medical provider or at the request of the employee or student. As a condition of employment, all individuals at risk at California State University, Fullerton must receive a pre-placement examination.

T.B. - Tuberculosis skin test and/or chest radiography as prescribed by the medical provider.

Vac. Vaccinations for tetanus, rabies, etc., will be offered and given per recommendations of the medical provider. All animal husbandry staff must be vaccinated for tetanus; vaccination is strongly recommended for all people involved with animal care and use.
